## Community Spotlight

Since opening its doors in 1966, a vital part of the spiritual fabric of St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School has been the presence of the Dominican Sisters of Amityville. Today, SJB continues to be blessed by five vibrant individuals from this religious community who enrich the daily experience of students, faculty, and staff alike. Each one has left an indelible mark on the institution through her embrace of the Dominican pillars of prayer, study, community, and service.

#### Sister Marie Happ, OP

Sr. Marie, the longest-tenured faculty member, has been witness to many changes at SJB since she first set foot in the building as a biology teacher in 1972. Upon completion of her Master's Degree in Biology in 1976, she became qualified to teach an advanced level Biology course which allows students to earn college credits through St. John's University. It is a class that she still enjoys teaching to this day. Sr. Marie served as the science department chairperson until 2020 and then shifted her attention to moderating the newly launched WeCare partnership with Good Samaritan Hospital. This program provides students the opportunity to shadow healthcare professionals in different departments at the hospital. Through

Sr. Marie's effort, the program has grown in size each year.

#### Sister Kathleen Gallina, OP

Sister Kathleen came to SJB in 2019 following a distinguished career as the principal at St. Rose of Lima Elementary School. Sister Antoinette lives by the credo, "If you love what you do, you never work a day in your life." This has been her experience since she began ministering at SJB in 2020. Sr. Antoinette has been impressed by the character of the young men and women who make up the SJB student body, something which gives her hope for the future.
