- You must type a 1-2 page essay about the reading.
- Details and examples from the book should be used whenever fitting.
- Please label each part and do them in the correct order.
- Be sure to follow MLA format:

 - o 1-inch margins all around
 - o Double-spaced
 - o MLA heading in the top left corner
 - o Example:

Directions: Your paper is a REFLECTION based on the book. Your paper is broken into two sections. In each section, questions have been provided to guide your response. Be sure to use

examples from the book and cite the pages in the book you quote or provide examples from.

Part I:

- Briefly summarize in one (1) paragraph the events described in the book.
- What part of the book impacted you the most and why? Explain your response.

Part II: History shows us that there are Enduring Issues. There are many issues in this book that you can make an argument for but for this assignment you are asked to focus on the Enduring Issue of Human Rights Violations and Inequality. Using the evidence from the reading, argue:

- Do you think a tragedy such as the Holocaust could occur in present times? Explain your answer. How could we ensure that this does not happen?
